How to Help Your Child Revise





"Parental Involvement: The Key to Student Success"

Research highlights the importance of parental involvement in shaping student success.

Studies show that students whose parents are actively engaged in their education tend to have better attendance, behaviour, grades and social skills.

There are three key parental behaviors that most predict academic achievement, regardless of family income or social standing:

- 1. Creating a home environment that supports learning.
- 2. Communicating high, yet realistic, expectations for achievement.
- 3. Staying involved in the child's education at school.

When parents are involved, not only do students benefit, but their overall performance and motivation improves. The stronger the school-home partnership, the higher the academic outcomes.

1. Creating a home environment that supports learning

- **Turn off distractions**: Encourage your child to turn off their phone, television
- Take regular breaks: Remind your child to give themselves regular breaks
- **Break up revision**: suggest they break their revision into smaller chunks.
- Start with something small: Suggest they begin with an easier task.
- Offer supervision and support: Agree a revision timetable and help them stick to it.
- Provide regular check-ins: keep them on track.
- Provide healthy snacks and drinks: Healthy snacks and drinks can keep energy levels up

Offer assistance with revision, and also let them know you're there to support them in whatever way they need.

2. Creating high, yet realistic expectations for achievement

- **Help them connect with their goals**: Encourage your child to think about why they want to do well in exams, whether it's for sixth form, college, or their dream job.
- Start early: Remind your child to begin revising early to reduce stress later on.
- **Promote positivity**: Revision can be tough, but stay positive and focus on long-term rewards
- Avoid comparisons: Encourage your child to focus on their own progress, not on others.
- **Create a supportive environment**: Offer a quiet study space and check in regularly to provide support without adding pressure.


3. Staying involved in the child's education at school.



- **Emails**: Sending important updates, reminders, and information.
- Phone calls: Direct conversations for urgent or personal matters.
- **Text messages**: Quick reminders or notifications.
- Letters: Formal communications such as reports
- Parent meetings: Face-to-face or virtual meetings to discuss progress or concerns.
- Online platforms: Using school websites or apps to share resources, schedules, and updates.
- Newsletters: Regular updates on school events, achievements, and news.



Advice for Parents: Revision Timetables



How can I help?

- Look at/ create Revision Timetable Together: break revision into manageable blocks of time, focusing on different subjects or topics each day.
- 2. **Incorporate Breaks**: include regular breaks
- 3. **Set Realistic Goals**: Help your child set achievable daily and weekly goals.
- 4. **Use Topic Planners**: Encourage your child to use topic planners for each subject.
- 5. **Regular Check-ins**: Regularly check in on your child's progress.

By helping your child with organisation and planning, you enable them to manage their time better, stay on track, and feel more in control during their revision process

Advice for Parents: Topic Planners



How can I help?

- 1. **Help Create a Clear Plan**: Sit down with your child and help them break their revision into manageable chunks.
- 2. **Set Targets and Celebrate Small Wins**: As your child works through their plan, celebrate the small successes
- 3. **Remind Them of the Big Picture**: Reassure your child that planning is not just about following a schedule, but also about feeling confident and prepared.
- 4. **Provide Encouragement and Reassurance**: Throughout the revision period, check in with your child to see how they're feeling. Offer encouragement.

By supporting your child in making a plan, you help them feel more confident and in control, which can make a huge difference in their ability to focus and succeed in their revision.

Advice for Parents: walk through exam papers




How can I help?

- Help Identify Key Topics: Encourage your child to check with subject teachers to find out which topics will be tested. This will allow them to focus their revision on the most relevant areas.
- Understand Exam Format: Assist your child in finding out how many papers they need to sit for each subject and the time allocated for each paper.
- Use Past Papers: Encourage your child to look at past papers to understand the types of questions that may come up. Reviewing these can help them feel more prepared and confident.

By helping your child check the topics for different subjects they will be able to better organize information, and revise efficiently and retain focused on the most important material.


Advice for Parents: promote healthy lifestyle

How can I help?



- Encourage Breaks from Screens: Remind your child to take breaks from their study area and avoid screen time during those breaks. This will help prevent eye strain and improve their focus when they return to studying.
- Promote Healthy Eating Habits: Suggest they eat meals away from their study space and screens to create a clear boundary between work and relaxation.
- Encourage Outdoor Time: Set a timer each day to remind your child to step outside and get some fresh air. This can help refresh their mind and body, reducing stress
- By supporting your child in taking these breaks, you'll help them avoid burnout and stay healthy, both physically and mentally, during their revision

Attendance is also key to success




How can I help?

check your writing- some humanities exams gives marks for SPAG


Always use specific vocabulary and give examples where possible in all subjects

Longer answer questions

- for lots of subjects, you will have to write longer answers.
- take some time to plan your answers
- planning helps you to get your ideas in order, so you don't run out of things to say once you've started writing

for each long answer question:

- read the question carefully
- read relevant text or sources that you need to
- check what command words and key terms the question uses

Next make a quick plan

- Jot down your main ideas
- Write key words about each idea that you will include
- outline the structure of your answer

You should aim to:

- start with a short Introduction
- use paragraphs to organise your points
- don't forget to link your paragraphs using such phrases as on the other hand and in addition
- use specific examples and precise quotes
- and with a brief summary that clearly reminds the reader of your main arguments

remember that your writing for an Examiner.

It's that time

Before the exam

The evening before

Spend the night before the exam making sure you're prepared eat a balanced meal

- get anything you are taking into the exam ready to go
- do something relaxing like some gentle exercise
- Read over some notes but don't cram all night

- take some deep breaths to calm yourself
- listen to the instructions given by the invigilators

Today is your opportunity to show what you know

During the exam

- read the instructions and each question carefully
- if you're not sure of an answer making educated guess
- keep an eye on the time so that you stay on track
- don't guess distracted, focus on you



After each exam

- Whether it's the first exam or the 10th and whether you think it went well or not congratulate yourself on getting a step closer to the end
- Remember worrying won't change anything
- you might find it stressful to talk to friends about the exam it's okay if you don't want to
- exams are tiring so try to relax after the exam or do something else that is fun
- if you have another exam on the same day or then next day you may want to have a quick look over some notes but be sure to take a break
